Mission of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul

Inspired by Gospel values, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a Catholic lay organization, leads women and men to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering in the tradition of its founder, Blessed Frédéric Ozanam, and patron, St. Vincent de Paul.

Organized locally, Vincentians witness God's love by embracing all works of charity and justice. The Society collaborates with other people of good will in relieving need and addressing its causes, making no distinction in those served because, in them, Vincentians see the face of Christ.

Vincentian Members

Membership in the United States totals more than 160,000 in 4,400 communities. The Society is present in 154 of 183 dioceses (84 percent). Active membership increased by nearly 2,000 from 2013.

Each Day throughout the U.S., Vincentians

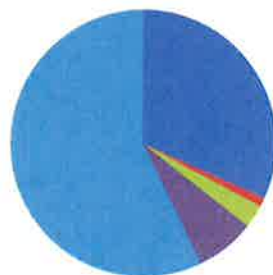
- Conducted 3,185 service visits to help the poor and needy
- Visited 1,762 households to offer material and spiritual help
- Offered 1,046 people spiritual aid (prayed with clients, distributed Bibles, rosaries, etc.)
- Referred 916 people to appropriate agencies for help
- Provided other services to help 692 people
- Made 401 visits to those in eldercare facilities
- Assisted 203 travelers in distress
- Met with the sick in 154 hospitals
- Made 61 visits to minister to those in prison
- Helped 11 people obtain jobs

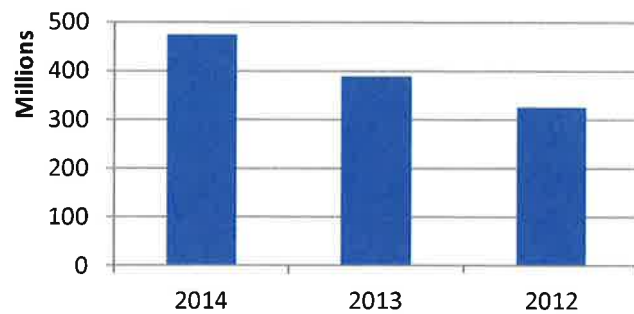

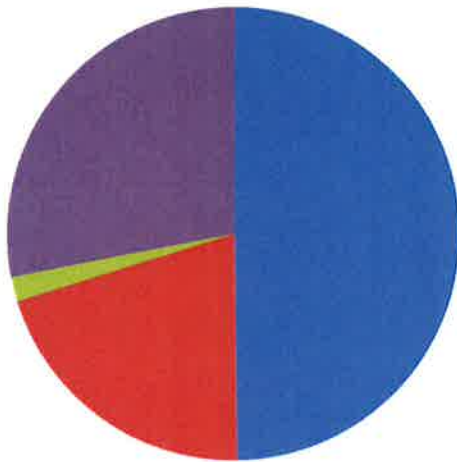
