Mission of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul

Inspired by Gospel values, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a Catholic lay organization, leads women and men to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering in the tradition of its founder, Blessed Frédéric Ozanam, and patron, St. Vincent de Paul.

Organized locally, Vincentians witness God's love by embracing all works of charity and justice. The Society collaborates with other people of good will in relieving need and addressing its causes, making no distinction in those served because, in them, Vincentians see the face of Christ.

Vincentian Members

Active and Associate membership in the United States totals more than 97,000 in 4,400 communities. The Society is present in 156 of 183 dioceses (85 percent). Membership increased by nearly 1,700 from 2014.

Each Day throughout the U.S., Vincentians

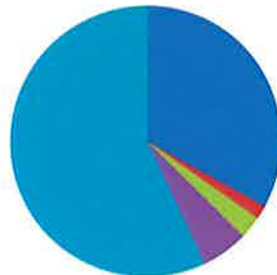
- Conducted 2,918 service visits to help the poor and needy
- Visited 1,689 households to offer material and spiritual help
- Offered 851 people spiritual aid (prayed with clients, distributed Bibles, rosaries, etc.)
- Referred 803 people to appropriate agencies for help
- Provided other services to help 388 people
- Made 286 visits to those in eldercare facilities
- Assisted 225 travelers in distress
- Visited with 138 people in hospitals
- Made 83 visits to minister to those in prison
- Helped 6 people obtain jobs

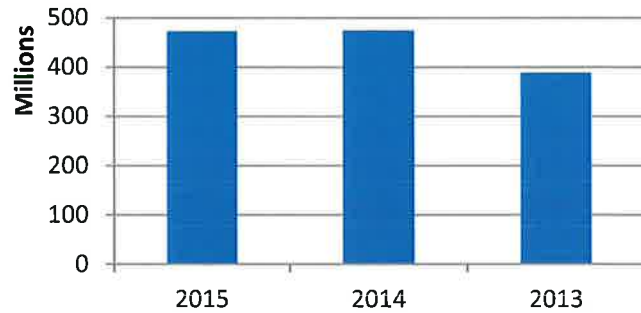

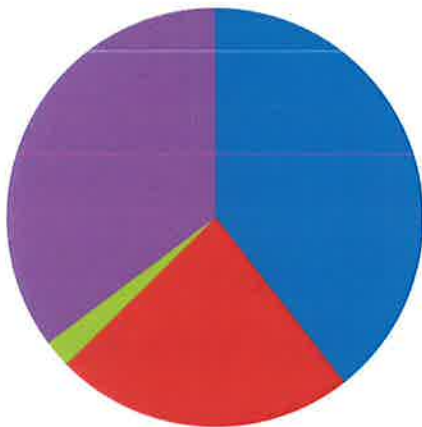
